Assembly Precautions


- 1. Assemble only according to these instructions. Improper assembly can create hazards.
- 2. Wear ANSI-approved safety goggles and heavy-duty work gloves during assembly.
- 3. Keep assembly area clean and well lit.

Use Precautions

- 1. This product is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with or near this item.
- 2. Setup and use indoors only. Keep dry.
- Do not overtighten workpiece; damage to workpiece may occur. Be careful not to pinch fingers when working
- 4. Locate Workbench on a flat, level, solid surface that is capable of supporting the weight of the workpiece, Workbench and tools.
- 5. Use as intended only.
- 6. Replace bulb only with same bulb size and rating.

- 4. Keep bystanders out of the area during assembly.
- 5. Do not assemble when tired or when under the influence of alcohol, drugs or medication.
- 6. Weight capacity and other product capabilities apply to properly and completely assembled product only.
- 7. Inspect before every use; do not use if parts are loose or damaged.
- Do not exceed listed weight capacity, evenly distributed **Be aware of dynamic loading!** Sudden load movement may briefly create excess load causing product failure.


Grounded Tools: Tools with Three Prong Plugs



3-Prong Plug and Outlet

- Tools marked with "Grounding Required" have a three wire cord and three prong grounding plug. The plug must be connected to a properly grounded outlet. If the tool should electrically malfunction or break down, grounding provides a low resistance path to carry electricity away from the user, reducing the risk of electric shock. (See 3-Prong Plug and Outlet.)
- 2. The grounding prong in the plug is connected through the green wire inside the cord to the grounding system in the tool. The green wire in the cord must be the only wire connected to the tool's grounding system and must never be attached to an electrically "live" terminal. (See 3-Prong Plug and Outlet.)
- The tool must be plugged into an appropriate outlet, properly installed and grounded in accordance with all codes and ordinances. The plug and outlet should look like those in the preceding illustration. (See 3-Prong Plug and Outlet.)

Double Insulated Tools: Tools with Two Prong Plugs



Outlets for 2-Prong Plug

- Tools marked "Double Insulated" do not require grounding. They have a special double insulation system which satisfies OSHA requirements and complies with the applicable standards of Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., the Canadian Standard Association, and the National Electrical Code.
- Double insulated tools may be used in either of the 120 volt outlets shown in the preceding illustration. (See Outlets for 2-Prong Plug.)

Extension Cords

- Grounded tools require a three wire extension cord. Double Insulated tools can use either a two or three wire extension cord.
- As the distance from the supply outlet increases, you must use a heavier gauge extension cord. Using extension cords with inadequately sized wire causes a serious drop in voltage, resulting in loss of power and possible tool damage. (See Table A.)
- 3. The smaller the gauge number of the wire, the greater the capacity of the cord. For example, a 14 gauge cord can carry a higher current than a 16 gauge cord. (See Table A.)
- When using more than one extension cord to make up the total length, make sure each cord contains at least the minimum wire size required.
 (See Table A.) If you are using one extension cord for more than one tool, add the nameplate amperes and use the sum to determine the required minimum cord size. (See Table A.)
- If you are using an extension cord outdoors, make sure it is marked with the suffix "W-A" ("W" in Canada) to indicate it is acceptable for outdoor use.
- Make sure the extension cord is properly wired and in good electrical condition. Always replace a damaged extension cord or have it repaired by a qualified electrician before using it.
- 7. Protect the extension cords from sharp objects, excessive heat, and damp or wet areas.

Assembly Instructions



Read the <u>ENTIRE</u> IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION section at the beginning of this document including all text under subheadings therein before set up or use of this product.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, all connections are made using Bolts, Washers and Nuts (B). Finger tighten all connections until assembly is done. Assemble the Workbench on a flat, level, hard surface.

- 1. Attach Side Beams (4) to Front (1) and Back Posts (2).
- 2. Attach Rubber Feet (3) to the bottom of each post.



3. Attach Bottom Beams (5) to Front and Back Posts.




 Attach Side Beam (4) and Side Beam with Power Strip Opening (4A) to the top 2 holes on Front Posts and the middle 2 holes on Back Posts.


Note: Side Beam with Power Strip Opening can be attached to either the right or left side.

5. Attach Power Strip (22) to Side Beam with Power Strip Opening using U Brackets (F) and Screws (E).




6. Attach Top Beams (6) to the top 2 holes on Front Posts and the middle 2 holes on Back Posts.


<u>Note:</u> Make sure the Front Top Beam carries the Warning Label and is right-side up.




7. Attach Front (7F) and Back (7B) Drawer Brackets to Top Beams.




- 8. Attach Middle Drawer Mount (8) to Front and Back Drawer Brackets.
- 9. Attach Left (9L) and Right (9R) Drawer Mounts to Front and Back Posts. Tighten hardware.




- Attach Drawer Handle (14) to the Front Drawer Panel (11) using Bolts, Washers and Nuts (A). Repeat for second Front Drawer Panel. Tighten hardware.
- Lay Drawer Bottom (13) down on a flat surface. Attach Right (10R) and Left (10L) Drawer Panels to the Front and Back (12) Drawer Panels. Repeat for second Drawer.
- 12. Install the Drawers, making sure the runners on the Drawers are level with the Drawer Mounts.




- 13. Attach left and right Back Upper Posts (15) to left and right Back Posts.
- 14. Attach Back Shelf Beam (16B) to Back Upper Posts.
- 15. Attach Left Shelf Beam (17L) and Right Shelf Beam (17R) to back Shelf Beam.
- 16. Attach Front Shelf Beam (16F) to Left and Right Shelf Beams.



17. Attach Pegboard (18) to Back Upper Posts and Middle Drawer Mount using Bolts, Washers and Nuts (C).




 Attach Bench Top (19) to Side Beams and Bottom Shelf (20) to Lower Side Beams using Bolts, Washers and Nuts (D).





19. Attach Top Shelf (21) to Shelf Beams using Bolts, Washers and Nuts (D).



- 20. Attach Light Fixture (23) to the underside of the Top Shelf using Bolts (G).
 - a. Insert a Bolt through each Light Fixture Clip.
 - b. Thread Bolts through the holes on the underside of the Top Shelf.
 - c. Push Light Fixture up into the Clips.



21. Attach the Light Fixture power cord to the receptacle at the end of the fixture. It will only connect one way. Route the cord through the hole in the Pegboard.

<u>Note:</u> Make sure all Shelves are level. Then, tighten all Bolts and Screws securely.

Maintenance and Servicing



Procedures not specifically explained in this manual must be performed only by a qualified technician.

TO PREVENT SERIOUS INJURY FROM ACCIDENTAL OPERATION: Make sure that the Trigger is in the off-position and unplug the tool from its electrical outlet before performing any procedure in this section.

TO PREVENT SERIOUS INJURY FROM TOOL FAILURE: Do not use damaged equipment. If abnormal noise or vibration occurs, have the problem corrected before further use.

Cleaning, Maintenance, and Lubrication

- 1. **BEFORE EACH USE**, inspect the general condition of the Workbench. Check for:
- 2. AFTER USE, wipe external surfaces with clean cloth.

- · loose hardware,
- · misalignment or binding of moving parts,
- · damaged cord/electrical wiring,
- cracked or broken parts, and
- any other condition that may affect its safe operation.

Replacing Light Bulb

The Light Fixture has a semitransparent cover over the bulb.

- 1. Allow Bulb to cool completely, then gently pull straight down at both ends of the cover and set aside.
- Remove the Bulb by rotating it 90°, rolling in a forward or backward direction and dropping the Bulb straight down.
- 3. With the prongs on either end of the Bulb vertically aligned, fit the new bulb up into the slots at the right and left fixture receptacles.
- Rotate the Bulb 90° again to seat the bulb. Replace the cover.


