- 11. **Keep children away**. Children must never be allowed in the work area.
- Store idle equipment. When not in use, tools must be stored in a dry location to inhibit rust. Always lock up tools and keep out of reach of children.


Maintenance and Servicing

- Before each use, inspect the general condition of the Grease Gun.
 Check for cracked or damaged parts, misaligned or binding of moving parts, leaking connections, and any other condition that may affect the product's safe operation.
 - If a problem occurs, have the problem corrected before further use.

 Do not use damaged equipment.
- After every use, dry with a soft cloth, remove all grease and debris from the Grease Gun. Do not use solvents to clean or immerse in any liquids.
- When storing, keep in a clean, dry and safe location away from children.
- CAUTION! All maintenance, service, and repairs not discussed in this manual should only be performed by qualified service technician.


Filling the Grease Gun

Installing Grease Cartridge



- Unscrew and remove the head of the Grease Gun from the Barrel.
- 2. Pull the Plunger Rod all the way back and ensure it is locked in place.
- Remove both ends from a 14 ounce grease cartridge (not included), and insert the cartridge into the Barrel in the direction indicated on the cartridge.
- Screw the Head back onto the Barrel.
- Depress the Release Latch, and push the Plunger Rod forward as far as possible.

Suction Filling



- Unscrew and remove the Head from the Barrel.
- Insert the open end of the Barrel into the grease. Slowly pull the Plunger Rod back while pushing the Barrel deeper into the grease to prevent air pockets from being pulled into the Barrel.
- When the Plunger Rod is fully extended, remove the Barrel from the grease. Wipe the exterior of the Barrel clean of grease.
- 4. Then, screw the Head back onto the Barrel.
- 5. Depress the Release Latch, and push the Plunger Rod back into the Barrel.



Priming the Grease Gun

<u>Note:</u> If the Grease Gun does not work properly, there may be air pockets in the Barrel. Eliminate air pockets by using EITHER of the following two methods.

Option 1:

- Release and push the Plunger Rod inward 2-3 times while simultaneously pressing the Manual Air Release Valve at the top of the grease gun, allowing trapped air to escape.
- 2. Operate gun.
- If grease comes out smoothly from the coupler, then grease gun is primed. If not, repeat.




Option 2:

- 1. Unscrew the Head 1-1/2 turns.
- Release plunger rod from locked position and gently turn the rod until it goes into the container tube.
- 3. After all excess air is expelled from the Barrel, retighten the Head.
- Wipe any grease off the exterior of the Barrel.

Operating the Grease Gun

- Clean the Grease Gun carefully and completely with a clean cloth before each use.
- Insert the Coupler of the Grease Gun fully onto the clean grease fitting of the object you are lubricating.
- With one hand, hold the Barrel securely.
 With the other hand, pump the Handle of the Grease Gun several times or until a small amount of grease begins to flow back out of the grease fitting.
- When greasing is complete, tilt coupler, twist nozzle of grease gun, and pull back to remove from fitting. Wipe any excess grease from exterior of the grease fitting and Coupler.



When finished, store the Grease Gun in a clean, dry, safe location out of reach of children.

Troubleshooting

Problem	Possible Causes	Likely Solutions
Grease gun does not properly dispense grease.	Trapped air in grease.	Loosen gun head. Move plunger rod in & out to remove air pockets. Tighten gun head.
	2. Cold grease.	2. Warm the gun.
	Grease gun extension blocked.	3. Remove & clean grease gun extension.
	Plunger rod did not enter the grease cartridge.	Maneuver plunger rod to properly go inside the cartridge.
Leaking grease from the back of gun.	Thin grease.	Use a thicker grease.
	Rubber follower in the plunger rod is damaged.	2. Unit needs to be replaced.
Lever or grip handle cannot be operated.	Gun piston damaged.	Replace gun.
Grease coupler is stuck on the grease fitting.	Grease fitting does not match.	Tilt the coupler, twist & then pull back.
