- 7. Assemble on a flat, level, hard and smooth surface capable of safely supporting a fully loaded Chest.

Use Precautions

TO PREVENT SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH FROM TIPPING:

- 1. Do not have more than one drawer open at a time.
- 2. DO NOT SIT, STAND OR CLIMB ON THIS ITEM. DO NOT STEP IN OR ON DRAWERS.
- 3. Do not allow children to play with or near this item. This item is NOT children's furniture.
- 4. Do not exceed drawer weight capacity, 120 lb per connected pair of slides. Evenly distribute load from bottom up. Uneven loading causes tipping. Be aware of dynamic loading! Sudden load movement may briefly create excess load causing tipping.
- 5. Close and lock drawers before moving. Do not pull, push to move.
- 6. Center securely within lip on top of cabinet.

- 7. Place on top of matching cabinet only.
- 8. Have assistant help place on cabinet.
- 9. Do not lift while loaded.
- 10. Close lid when not in use. Lid must be open for drawers to be unlocked.
- 11. Use as intended only.
- 12. Inspect before every use; do not use if parts are loose or damaged.
- Maintain product labels and nameplates. These carry important safety information. If unreadable or missing, contact Harbor Freight Tools for a replacement.



- 1. Assemble on a flat, level, hard and smooth surface capable of safely supporting a fully loaded Chest.
- 2. Locate the Keys, label them, then put them in a safe place.
- 3. Fit top of each Handle into the two slots in the side of the chest and then secure with Handle Bolts.

WARNING! TO PREVENT SERIOUS

INJURY: Proper Handle assembly is critical to ensure safety while lifting Chest.

- 4. Choosing location:
 - a. If stacking Top Chest on Bottom Cabinet, refer to Bottom Cabinet Owner's Manual for Final Assembly, Operation and Maintenance Instructions.
 - b. If using Top Chest separately from Bottom Cabinet, refer to Operation and Maintenance Instructions on page 5.



Operation Instructions



Read the <u>ENTIRE</u> IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION section at the beginning of this document including all text under subheadings therein before set up or use of this product.

1. Empty all Drawers.

Note: Lid must be open for Drawers to be unlocked.

- 2. Close all Drawers and lock them.
- 3. If using separately from Bottom Cabinet, hold both handles securely and carry the Chest to the desired location. Have someone assist as needed.
- **Maintenance and Servicing**



Procedures not specifically explained in this document must be performed only by a qualified technician.

TO PREVENT SERIOUS INJURY FROM TOOL FAILURE: Do not use damaged equipment. If any part becomes damaged, have the problem corrected before further use.

- 1. **PERIODICALLY,** inspect the general condition of the Chest. Check for:
 - loose hardware,
 - · misalignment or binding of moving parts,
 - · cracked or broken parts,
 - any other condition that may affect its safe operation.

- 4. Place only on a flat, level, hard and smooth surface capable of safely supporting a fully loaded Chest.
- 5. Unlock Drawers and fill Chest evenly, from bottom to top. Do not exceed weight capacities.

- 2. Wipe external surfaces of the Chest with clean cloth.
- 3. Lubricate Drawer Slides as needed.


